Pastoral Reflection

Reflection for the New Year: Seeking Christ in All Things

For the observant Orthodox Christian, February is a transitional month.

At the beginning, we celebrate the Great Feast of the Meeting of the Lord (Feb. 2), which itself brings to a conclusion a long, bright deep winter festival period stretching from Advent through Christmas and Theophany to the leave-taking of the Meeting (Feb. 9), which is also the beginning of the Triodion. With the Triodion, things begin to shift as we prepare for Great Lent, which begins on Monday, March 3. This shift is marked by the four preparatory Sundays: Publican and Pharisee (Feb. 9), Prodigal Son (Feb.16), Last Judgement (Feb. 23), and the Expulsion of Adam and Eve from Paradise (March 2). Each of these weeks offers profound reflections on important spiritual themes as well as changes in diet in anticipation of our Lenten fasting.

Fasting is, together with good works and prayer, a key discipline of observant Orthodoxy. It is a common and popular idea that, on a practical level, Lent is all about making some sacrifices and giving up things. That it is about abstaining from this or that food, giving up select treats and comforts, cutting back on entertainment, avoiding social events and so on.

But while this is partly true - and is actually what happens in some measure for those who try to observe the Fast - the texts concerning Lent - the hymns and prayers and readings for each day of the Fast - emphasize something else. They emphasize that our Lenten discipline and effort is a path to, and an anticipation of, our return to Paradise. The Sunday before we enter Lent sets before us the sad, tragic reality of our Fall from Paradise and calls us to take up those things which are signs and anticipations of Paradise restored.

In Great Lent we anticipate Paradise, the Heaven opened us through the death and resurrection of Christ. Eden restored. Paradise is the Kingdom of God, His good creation restored and renewed. In Paradise we don't eat each other. We don't slaughter and butcher each other. We do not commodify and process each other. For example, the vegan diet recommended to us by the Church for this Lenten season is something positive, an opportunity to participate in the reversal of one of the consequences of the Fall. Another example is that we are called to treat each other compassionately and with love, kindness, and mercy.

The Orthodox theological vision invites us to stretch our imagination, to try on something different, to enrich our experience, by taking up fasting, good works, and prayer seriously for at least this liturgical season. The Lenten way of life is meant to be a foretaste of the Kingdom, of Paradise. Our thinking about fasting and abstinence should not be 'oh my gosh, I have to give something up!' but 'thank goodness I have this window of opportunity to do this thing!'

A verse repeated in the Triodion says: 'Faithful, Let us enter the fast with joy!' February is the month to plan for it. Let's do it!

While the most important aspects of our parish life are our faith, worship, and lives as Orthodox Christians, there is still the fact that we have facilities and grounds to take care of, our clergy and staff to compensate.

As I end my second term as president I would like to thank all who have helped and supported me, the officers, board members, and service attendants, all who have contributed their time and talents in service to Christ and our parish. The life of our parish is founded upon the prayers and contributions of all of us.

This has been a job that has been at times interesting, enlightening, frustrating, and enjoyable but always rewarding. I apologize and ask forgiveness of any I have offended over the course of the years.

2025 Annual Parish Meeting

Choir Notes

This month begins with the Entrance of the Lord into the Temple which reminds me of the great entrance, the time when the clergy process the bread and wine from the table of oblation to the Altar while the choir sings its most beautifully arranged hymn of the day. The Lord enters the Temple, and it is beautiful. We put a lot into making this so. We see it in the icons, the vestments, the intricate woodworking, and the filigree along the iconostasis. We smell it with the incense, the beeswax candles, the tang of singed altar boy hairs. We taste it in the Body and Blood of Christ, and the antidoron after. And, of course, we hear the beautification of the Temple in the words of the prayers and the music arranged to adorn them.

As you know, these things don't just come into being. A person isn't born as a master iconographer, they may have the talent for it, but that talent needs to be invested in. For this purpose, there is the annual iconography workshop here at the Cathedral.

Choir-wise, we have the Pan-Orthodox Choir Ministry (POCM), a fledgling ministry with aspirations of helping musicians of all talents and interests hone their skills for the beautification of the Lord's Temple, and His Glory. POCM does this through various events and the one coming up that I want to make you aware of is their third annual benefit concert for FOCUS which will be Saturday, February 22, at 7 p.m., the day before Meatfare Sunday at St. Mary's Greek Orthodox Church (3450 Irving Ave S. Minneapolis). It is a free-will concert and all donations go directly to FOCUS. Mark your calendars!

Through the lens of Orthodox culture, concerts are an interesting topic in that they are seemingly completely contrary to prayer and are seemingly all for show, "look at us and hear how good we are!"

However, concerts are not meant to replace prayer, and if you were to talk to the performers, you'd find a significant amount of piety. Many are shy and don't think that they sing very well. Which is something that, any audience member will know immediately is not true (but don't tell them that, humility is a good thing).

In the music world, concerts are more than a show. They are, generically, a tool used to hone the craft. They are the means to the end, not the other way around. In preparing for a concert, the last thing you want to do is mess up or sound bad, especially in front of a room full of strangers! So, musicians practice and practice and practice, resulting in a more beautiful sound which, upon return, will make the Temple all the more beautiful.

But there's more to a POCM concert. Singers from smaller parishes have the opportunity to sing in a big choir. With three different directors leading, singers are exposed to three different directing styles. The directors enjoy the challenge of leading a big choir of mostly new singers. They also get the opportunity to sit back and just sing. Everyone is exposed to different rehearsal styles and layouts leading to the strengthening and developing of skills that can be brought back to home parishes. And arching over all of this, this year's singers are coming from at least five different parishes working together, forming and strengthening friendships; ultimately enriching and strengthening the Orthodox Community here in the Twin Cities area.

I sincerely hope that you will be free to join us on the 22nd of February. Glory to Jesus Christ! Glory to God forever!


