

Choir Notes

Saints Who Sing

During this month we are immersed in the beauty and prayerfulness of the Lenten Season. Last year at this time I wrote my first reflection about Saints Who Sing, talking briefly about St Ephraim the Syrian and his beautiful prayer. This prayer is recited at all daily services, and most of you reading this (actually I sometimes wonder if anyone is reading this series) will connect the prayer to Pre-Sanctified Liturgy and the MEOCCA sponsored Lenten Vespers on Sunday evenings.

A few months ago, while singing daily vespers, one of the hymns prescribed for the day indicated **Saint Sophronius Patriarch of Jerusalem** as the author. Then his name appeared again during Matins for the Feast of Theophany. I began wondering about this saint whose hymns have been preserved for centuries.

Little is known about the early life of St Sophronius. He was born in Damascus around the year 560 and is believed to have been a studious and pious child, devoted to study of the classics. He first traveled to Bethlehem, eventually settling in Egypt. It was in Egypt after recovering from an illness that Sophronius was tonsured a monk.

St Sophronius was the spiritual son of John Moschus whom he first met in Jerusalem. John is remembered as the author of Spiritual Meadow, and St Sophronius is thought to have assisted with the compilation. Most English translations of this spiritual book provide the reader with an insight into the life, thoughts, and experiences of the Egyptian desert fathers, and others from the regions of Palestine and Syria, in the late 6th and early 7th centuries.

In addition to this book, St Sophronius is especially remembered for penning the Life of Saint Mary of Egypt, which is read in Orthodox parishes and monasteries throughout the world during the fifth week of Great Lent.

While Mary of Egypt passed away 40 years before Sophronius was born, he was so moved by her life, he recorded the story to provide the faithful with an example of repentance and dedication to Christ.

An introduction of this story includes these words of St Sophronius:

"It is good to hide the secret of a king, but it is glorious to reveal and preach the works of God" (Tobit 12:7). So said the Archangel Raphael to Tobit when he performed the wonderful healing of his blindness. Actually, not to keep the secret of a king is perilous and a terrible risk, but to be silent about the works of God is a great loss for the soul. And I, in writing the life of St. Mary of Egypt, am afraid to hide the works of God by silence. Remembering the misfortune threatened to the servant who hid his God-given talent in the earth (Mat. 25:18-25), I am bound to pass on the holy account that has reached me. And let no one think that I have had the audacity to write untruth or doubt this great marvel – may I never lie about holy things! If there do happen to be people who, after reading this record, do not believe it, may the Lord have mercy on them because, reflecting on the weakness of human nature, they consider impossible these wonderful things accomplished by holy people. But now we must begin to tell this most amazing story, which has taken place . . ."

While nothing is mentioned in the history of St Sophronius about him being an amazing singer or chanter, we do know that he wrote over 900 troparia and stikhera, many still preserved to this day. He also wrote three Canons which are included in the Lenten Triodion.

Sophronius was chosen as Patriarch and ruled for 10 years from 634-644. Towards the

end of his life, Jerusalem was under siege by the Moslems. It is believed the Patriarch died from a broken heart as he watched the sacred sites of his beloved Jerusalem attacked and desecrated.

The Orthodox Church commemorates **St Sophronius, Patriarch of Jerusalem**, (and another Saint Who Sings) on **March 11th**.

You were most wise among patriarchs, Sophronius of Jerusalem. You struggled with divine zeal, spreading the commandments of truth with your lips. You set right the foundations of the Church and firmly established the monastic order. You brought to light wise sermons, and instructed by them, therefore we cry out to you: "Rejoice, splendid boast of the Orthodox." Kontakion of the Saint

Saints Friday Night Lenten Dinners

Friday night Lenten Dinners are returning! Please join us for food and fellowship on Fridays: February 27, March 6, March 13, March 20, March 27, & April 3. Dinners will be served immediately following Pre-Sanctified Liturgy. There will be a speaker each week.

Dinner includes our famous salad bar each week plus a surprise entree (soup, veggie chili, pasta...), bread, and dessert. All prepared by the St. Mary's Saints Youth Group and various adult volunteers. Cost \$10 Adults, \$5 youth, free for those under five years old. There is a price cap of \$30 for a family. If you just want dessert and a beverage \$3 for Adults and \$1 for Kids.

We had great success last year with hosts willing to prepare the main Lenten entree for each week's meal. We also graciously accept help with set-up, serving, clean-up, and donated desserts. Youth who help at the dinners will be able to earn community service hours for any organizations they are members of. All proceeds from the dinners will benefit our Saints youth program. We are also seeking Open Gym Helpers following the meal. We are looking for 2-3 adults each night to monitor and engage with the youth! Gym assistants receive their Lenten dinner free of charge, set up the gym for activities, monitor the gym while the speaker for the Lenten dinner presents, and then tidy up the gym after the activity time. Time commitment is approximately 90 minutes to 2 hours, depending on the activity for the evening. If you are interested in helping with youth in the gymnasium please contact Chris Gulachek. If there are no volunteers to monitor the gymnasium, there will be no Open Gym.

Capital Campaigns & Kitchen Donation Update

The following is a happy update regarding capital campaigns and the official closing-in-a-good-way of the Kitchen Renovation Project. For bigger context, moving into 2026, St. Mary's is trying to have fewer capital campaign projects open: realistically, a capital campaign should be focused on just one project instead of split amongst three, four, or five competing projects. Having too many projects open can cause confusion when parishioners are deciding where to donate their money, and managing too many accounts can become burdensome, and not get us the best return on investment. We also want to avoid having too many "zombie" projects out there: projects that are in many ways done, yet not fully complete, and thus they linger on - never dying, but not fully alive (much like how members of those projects may feel).

All that being said, it is with happiness that we can, in fact, close the Kitchen Renovation as a capital campaign project. This does NOT mean that we will stop doing maintenance in the kitchen or that we cannot buy needed items. It simply means that since all the big-ticket items and work associated with the Kitchen Renovation have been completed, it no longer needs to stay open as a capital campaign. Future purchases (e.g., new cutting boards or replacing a faucet) could come from the General Fund or Property Maintenance fund, for example. A HUGE thank you to all those who have contributed their money and time to helping this project cross the finish line!

What does this mean moving forward? Effective now, any donations via Venmo or ACH that are earmarked for "kitchen" will instead go to Parish Homes. And this will become standard practice in 2026: as we close out other capital campaigns, we will update the parish about where donations to a finished campaign will go to.
