Pastoral Reflection

As many as have been baptized into Christ have put on Christ! (Galatians 3:27)

Holy Saturday is the traditional day for the Baptism of converts - catechumens - who during the 40 days of Great Lent have been focused on preparing to be received into the Church. This year, on April 19, we will be receiving a large number of catechumens at St Mary's. Throughout the country, Orthodox parishes everywhere will be receiving an unprecedented number of converts. With this great joy will come a great responsibility to provide ongoing spiritual nurture for these new Orthodox Christians.

According to the Apostle Paul, our Baptism is our unique personal participation in the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. We link this Baptism with Chrismation, an anointing with a specially consecrated Holy Oil, and say that Chrismation 'completes' our Baptism. Chrismation is said to be our unique personal reception of the Holy Spirit. Baptism and Chrismation go together because Pascha and Pentecost - the Resurrection of Christ and the outpouring of the Holy Spirit - go together.

We not only celebrate these wonderful events, but we are products of them. We are made Christians not by family tradition or ethnicity or cultural inheritance, but by Baptism. We have received new life, our Christian identity, have become members of the Body of Christ, by the sacramental acts that unite us to Christ and form Him in us by the power of the Holy Spirit.

This month we will proceed through Great Lent and participate in Holy Week and celebrate Pascha. Our sacramental life, like our liturgical life, links us with the 'big picture', the grand design, the providential pattern and meaning of everything - which is found in Christ. As a community of believers, and within that community each one of us personally and uniquely, and as we accompany our catechumens and together with them, to behold the Resurrection of Christ and receive the Holy Spirit.

We see in the lives of the saints examples of those who embrace the story of salvation, or are embraced by the story, and receive the gift with thankfulness. They are witnesses to the spiritual reality of the Grace given to all of us. In their presence (and we are surrounded by them!) we are reminded that we have been given new life in order to live, to use it. And the gifts of the Holy Spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control, ought to be defining characteristics of how we are trying to live in light of the Resurrection.

The church is looking for a Visitation Coordinator to help organize two key activities with volunteers:


- 1. Easter Visits Coordinating visits to homebound/shut-in members and delivering flowers.
- 2. Christmas Visits Organizing visits during the holiday season and delivering poinsettias.




Help Wanted - Office Assistant

Choir Notes

We begin the month of April just over halfway through Great Lent. The Hymns of St. Ephraim have *hopefully* filled us with an awareness of our current state of needing God; His love, His mercy, and His Grace. Lent is a time when we strive to weaken the hold the world has on us, while strengthening our bonds to Christ. Practically speaking, the weakening takes on the appearance of fasting from various foods, and hobbies; denying ourselves and the passions that have their grip on us. While the strengthening takes action in the forms of almsgiving, forgiveness, prayer, finding the silver lining in a situation even when it's just the humility it gives us or when it forces us to realize we have to trust in God. And, let us not forget, attending more church services, and doing even more there.

This being an article on the Choir Notes page, you might not be surprised to read that doing more at church could involve singing in the choir. If you are interested, keep an eye out for some upcoming "Open Choir Sundays" when you are free and welcome to come up and see what it's like to sing in the choir. There are enough of the regulars that we shouldn't get too off track, and they can manage the pages of the binders so all you have to do is sing.

Of course, there are a few ground rules to being in the choir loft that should be mentioned. The big one is to, as much as possible, not be disruptive. We'll want to limit movement during singing, and certainly limit chatting to a soft whisper and only when necessary. Our focus in the loft is to work with the clergy, and we can't do that if we can't hear them. Hopefully not being disruptive doesn't sound scary, it's what we're all already doing in church anyway.

If, after this foray into the choir loft you're not scared away and traumatized, reach out to me and let me know so we can talk about how we can get you more involved. I know, I know, I look scary with my perpetual frown and angry demeanor, but I'm probably just thinking about cheeseburgers and will be happy for the distraction.

Also this month, we will arrive at the Feast of Feasts, Pascha! And right before that, on Holy Saturday, we'll hear fifteen Old Testament readings that are wonderful and edifying and rich and ripe for a member of the clergy to tell you all about them! For my part, I just want to say that these readings have historically (and traditionally!) been read by the youth in our parish. If your youth, or youths, are interested in reading/chanting for the church, definitely let me know and keep an eye out for more information regarding these Old Testament readings.

The youth have been doing a fantastic job reading for Great Vespers almost every Saturday since December. It has been

a real treat to see and hear them grow in confidence and ability. I know that at times they can be hard to hear, so I ask for your forgiveness in that regard and also ask for your patience. It takes courage to stand up and chant in front of many people, and after a few positive experiences, confidence begins to grow and then things really take off. If we want good readers down the road, it means we may have to put up with a few times when we can't hear so well. Speaking of finding silver linings, these times could be excellent opportunities to take out your prayer rope and say a few extra prayers. Pray for the young readers, that they may grow strong in their faith and become valiant defenders and leaders of the church.

Sing praises to our God, sing praises! Sing praises to our King, sing praises!

- Erection of scaffolding and protective tarping
- Removal of Icon canvases
- Stenciling of existing decorative vine work.
- Removal of damaged plaster & apply new plaster
- Primer and painting

- Restoration of original decorative vine work
- Reinstallation of Icon canvases
