PASTORALLY SPEAKING

Christ is Risen!

The radiant news of Christ's resurrection fills us with heaven-sent jubilation. For the entire Paschal season, themes of healing, forgiveness, and joy will fill our liturgical services. We are reminded of the promise in 1 Peter 1:3: "According to his great mercy, he has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead."

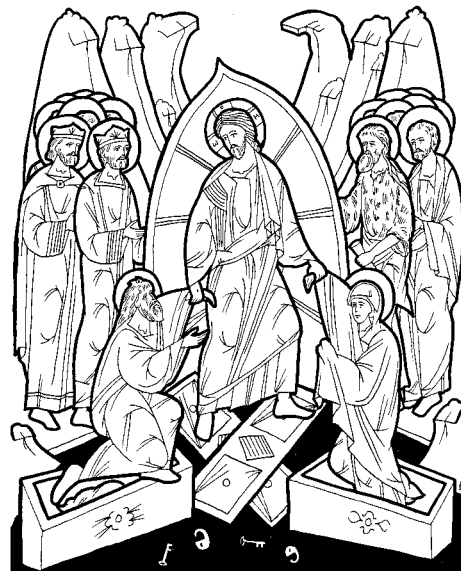
Let us keep in mind, however, that this is not a time when we can take a "spiritual vacation." As the Apostle Paul exhorts in Galatians 6:9: "And let us not grow weary of doing good, for in due season we will reap, if we do not give up." The joy of Pascha bears the deepest value in our lives when we continue in our spiritual work of prayer, abstinence from sin, and acts of mercy.

Throughout the Paschal season, let us take care that we do not abandon the spiritual gifts we nurtured in our fasting. We must hold fast to what we have gained, following the wisdom of Hebrews 2:1: "Therefore we must pay much closer attention to what we have heard, lest we drift away from it."

As our Lord reminds us in the Passion Gospels that we heard during Holy Week, we must always be vigilant. In Mark 14:38, Christ warns us: "Watch and pray that you may not enter into temptation. The spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak." Regardless of the season or time of year, each and every day may bring us either defeat through our fall into sin or spiritual victory, by the grace of our Risen Lord. May the brilliance of our Lord's resurrection light our path on the way of all godliness and holiness.

CHOIR NOTES

I'm afraid I do not feel as articulate as I usually do these days. Fortunately, I know the readers of this article to be understanding folks, and I'm hopeful my clumsy attempt at articulating some recent thoughts will be somewhat understandable.

Going through Holy Week and right through Pascha, I find myself reflecting on Life and Death, and related, immortality. The quest for immortality, a common trope of fantasy stories: movies, books, and such. It pervades our society and our way of thinking, hinting at some deep-seated idea, perhaps, that it is attainable to us. Or, thinking about the Garden of Eden, I wonder if it's also because it's something we had and lost. Whatever the reason, we in the world search for it, and headlines are constantly proclaiming that they have found the cure, and all one has to do is buy into whatever the article is selling.

He who saved the three young men in the furnace became incarnate and suffered as a mortal man through His sufferings He clothed what is mortal in the robe of immortality He alone is blessed and most glorious, the God of our fathers.

~ Paschal Matins Ode 7

"[God] is clothing what is mortal with the robe of immortality..." There it is. I'm not really surprised, to be honest. The church teaches that God is immortal, beyond time, without beginning or end, etc. The church also teaches Theosis, oneness with God. But here we get it plainly, God clothing what is mortal (like me and you), with the robe of immortality. But I've been to Pascha year after year. And before me, countless Orthodox Christians have done the same, and they all died.

This is the day of resurrection. Let us be illumined, O people. Pascha the Pascha of the Lord! For from death to life and from Earth to Heaven has Christ our God led us, as we sing the song of victory.

~ Paschal Matins, Ode 1

Ah, perhaps this is the part I missed, "from death to life, and from Earth to Heaven has Christ our God led us..." So, Christ not only robes us in immortality, He also leads us to Heaven.

This year, there have been quite a few more funerals than in other years, so the Kontakion is close at hand.

With the saints give rest, O Christ, to the souls of Thy servants, where there is neither sickness nor sorrow and no more sighing, but life everlasting.

~ Funeral, Kontakion

Here we have some insight into the place where Christ is leading us with robes of immortality. A place where sickness, sorrow, and sighing do not exist. This brings me to one of the most favored moments of the Paschal services:

Do not lament me, O mother, seeing me in the tomb, the Son conceived in the womb without seed, for I shall arise and be glorified with eternal glory as God. I shall exalt all who magnify you in faith and in love.

~ Nocturnes, Ode 9

"Do not lament me...for I shall arise.." In other words, do not give in to utter despair. Hope. While this death may seem pointless right now, there is a point, and it involves Life. Grieve, be sad, but also hope, and do not despair.

There are many, many more hymns of the church that we sing, and each one says what it needs to say way better than I ever could. I invite you to come to as many services as you can and to listen and attend to the words. There's a lot of wonderful stuff there.
